Chairman's Message

We are nearing the end of another year with 1 chapter event left, the annual Christmas brunch at Bud Bay Café in Olympia December 6th at 11:00 AM. Make sure you RSVP me by Thanksgiving if you will be attending the brunch. We want everyone to have a seat reserved with no surprises. In the last 12 months, we have lost 4 members which has been hard as I have spent time with all 4 of them. They will be remembered for the influence on my corvette life. In Utah in 2005 on the judging field, Larry Richter came to the rescue, replacing a blown fuse, and allowing me to achieve my goal of earning a founders award. In 2012, Wayne Parkin wanted us to judge his car. After checking out his car that summer, he was determined to improve his car and receive a top flight award. The hours that the chapter members who helped him with his car, and his on-line registration challenge, paid dividends as he received his blue ribbon in June. I am happy I could be a part of his journey. That car has a new care taker and I hear we will see the car return to the judging field in Bend next year.

During the year, we gained 14 new members to the chapter, with most of them attending at least one event this year. After years of no chapter events in Western Oregon, the chapter held 2 events in Wilsonville and 1 in Elmira. Thanks to Dean and Traci Sprecher, Karl and Sue Hallstrom, for hosting the events. We had 34 members attend the April judging school in Wilsonville which showed there was a definite need for events in Oregon. With an increase in the chapter membership I would hope we could continue the good attendance for years to come. It takes your involvement to make your chapter successful.

In September, the membership was mailed a ballot to vote on a change in the chapter by-laws as well as election of officers for next year. After the creation of the B.C. chapter, it didn't make sense to continue to have an open board position for an area coordinator covering B.C and Alaska. Fall City Judging event

On October 17th Mike Doty and Wayne Loron lead a Chapter Judging Meet on the Donnelly's 67 Coupe. It was a fun day of learning for a couple of new members as they OJ'd with more experienced members and helped the Donnelly's with objective feedback on their coupe.

The Donnelly's are no strangers to getting a Corvette sorted out for flight judging having earned a Top Flight with their Beautiful 68 last year in Tacoma. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped with the event.

The prized Corvette was one of the Great 8 that were swallowed up by the sinkhole that opened up in the National Corvette Museum's Skydome back in February of 2014. Nearly a year and half later we're happy to report that the restoration is complete and that the car was unveiled at the NCM earlier this morning.

The overhaul of the white 1992 convertible took over four months and some 1,200 man-hours of work. The rebuild team was made up of approximately 30 people from GM Design's Mechanical Assembly group and GM Service Operations. The group, which was represented by UAW locals 160 and 1869, pledged to preserve and repair as of the original car as possible.





"Chevrolet is proud to have helped restore this extremely significant car in Corvette's long, storied history," said Mark Reuss, GM executive vice president, Global Product Development, Purchasing and Supply Chain. "When we disassembled it, we found that each employee involved in building it had signed a part of the car, which was fantastic and moving to see. It brought the history to life, and reinforced the importance of the project." Only two of the hundreds of signed components were not able to be saved. On those parts the autographs were scanned, reproduced as transfers, and placed on the new parts. Only 1 signature couldn't be preserved – that of Angela Lamb. To maintain the car's heritage Chevrolet worked with the National Corvette Museum and were able to score a new signature from Lamb on that replacement component.

Some of the major parts replaced included the hood, front fascia, and the gill panels between the front wheels and the doors. Many miscellaneous supporting bits under the hood were replaced as well. Most parts were sourced from another white C4 to maintain correctness. Other items like the rear fascia and front exhaust system were carefully repaired because they were covered in signatures.

Restored 1 Millionth Corvette

The front sub-frame was straightened, and the original wheels were damaged, but reconditioned. They still wear the original Goodyear Eagle GS-C tires in which they were wrapped back in 1992. The instrument panel's soft cover was removed and replaced in order to preserve all of the signatures beneath it. The bright red leather seats with their unique "1,000,000th Corvette" embroidered headrest logos were carefully restored including some replacement patches of the same leather. The LT1 engine, automatic transmission, the rest of the drive train were found to be still in good working condition.

Interestingly, the crushed windshield header did not have to be replaced. The team was able move it back to its original location. "The header restoration was a wonderful surprise for what everyone assumed would be the toughest aspect of the restoration," said David Bolognino, director of GM Global Design Fabrication Operations. "With access to the original specifications, we got it spot-on – and even the new windshield glass dropped in perfectly."

Lastly, the "1,000,000th" windshield banner was able to be reproduced using the same computer graphic file used to create the original.

Now with the restoration complete, the 1 millionth Corvette will take its rightful place back on display inside the National Corvette Museum. It will be on display starting today, continuing through the NCM's 21st anniversary celebration this weekend, and beyond.





This Day in History

On October 11th, 2008, a man from Belgium named Luc Costermans sets a new world speed record for blind drivers: 192 mph. Costermans set the record in a borrowed Lamborghini Gallardo on a long, straight stretch of airstrip near Marseilles, France. He was accompanied by a carload of sophisticated navigational equipment as well as a human co-pilot, who gave directions from the Lamborghini's passenger seat.

The record Costermans broke had been set exactly three years before by the British driver Mike Newman. On that day, Newman had coaxed his 507-horsepower BMW M5 to a top speed of 178.5 mph. (Over a measured mile, Newman's speed averaged 167.32 mph.) For his part, Newman had smashed a 2-year-old record—144.7 mph—that he had set himself in a borrowed Jaguar, just three days after he learned to drive. Unlike Costermans, Newman did not race with a co-pilot or a navigator. Instead, he got his father-in-law to zoom around the track behind him, shouting directions over the radio.

Both of these blind record-setters were all-around daredevils who raced all sorts of vehicles. In 2001, for example, Newman became the fastest blind motorcycle driver in the world (his record speed was 89 mph) just four days after learning to ride; five years later, Costermans flew a small airplane all around France. (He was joined by an instructor and a navigator.) Another record-setter, an Englishman named Steve Cunningham, had set the land-speed record himself in 1999 (147 mph, while driving a £70,000 Chrysler Viper) at the same time that he held the sea-speed record for a blind sailor. In 2004, guided by sophisticated talking navigational software, Cunningham became the first blind pilot to circumnavigate the United Kingdom by air.

2016 Corvette & High Performance Meet!

It's that time again!

There are changes coming for the 2016 Corvette & High Performance Meet!

Let's get right to it- new days, new hours, some exhibits temporarily relocated, Fairgrounds construction this year and thereafter and a few other things just for good measure.

FRIDAY & SATURDAY, NO SUNDAY-Many of you may recall that we polled vendors (and the public) last year regarding going to a Friday & Saturday format with no Sunday activities. The responses were not unanimous but overwhelmingly consistent to move in this direction. This was not an easy decision on our part because there were some compelling arguments to keep Sunday. However; we are going to test this option in 2016 and see how it works. There is no doubt in my mind that we will get more feedback and response once the 2016 event is in the books.

NEW HOURS FOR VENDORS AND PUBLIC- Here's what the new schedule of activities will look like:

Friday

8:00AM - 8:00PM Vendor gates open, including "at the gate" sales for vendors who did not preregis-

ter.

2:00PM – 8:00PM General admission for public

8:00PM Show closes

Saturday

7:00AM Vendor gates open

8:00AM General admission opens 4:00PM General admission closes 8:00PM Vendor exit gates close

There will not be any Sunday activities or grounds access.

EXHIBITOR RELOCATION- The Next Generation exhibits, including the Valve Cover Races will be temporarily moved from the Expo Hall to the Pavilion Building, merging with the Invitational Vehicle Display. Some booth spaces around the Gold Gate fountain area will not be available.

FAIRGROUNDS CONSTRUCTION- In the immediate future, the Centennial Building (the tent structure by the Blue gate) and Cow Barns next to the Centennial Building will be removed and a new building or buildings will be constructed. The exact impact of this construction on this year's show is not known at the moment. We expect to have both buildings available for the show but that is subject to the contractor's construction schedule. Many of you have survived previous construction impacts with us and the end results have been worth the short term inconvenience. We'll get through this, patience is the key.

OTHER TOPICS- There were no increases in booth fees or general admission prices this year.

The total hours the show will be open to the public this year is ½ hour less than previous years. Our expectation is that vendors will do more business with the public Friday and Saturday than previously done on Saturday and Sunday. That should make at least some folks happy.

The Early Entry ticket program is under review. Stay tuned!

Yes, we are late this year getting information out to you. Partly the result of unresolved issues with the new format and partly because sometimes life just gets busy- please forgive us!
